

-no need to add your name and date at the top; just do the usual copyright info (© @U2/Cropp, 2020) at the bottom

P1, S1: hyperlink “announced” to the article announcing the channel, either our piece on it or the official notice

P1, S3: it should be “physical format”

P2, S2: say “had expired”

P2, S3: say “whenever we were driving” to avoid repetition

P2, S4: say “love both the Beatles and a happy passenger”

P3, S4: just say “U2X Radio,” not “the”

P4, S1: put a comma after “programs”, and put the titles of all the radio shows in quotes and capitalize every word in the titles; also, no comma after “Flanagan”; finally, put a comma after “Dark Horse Radio”

P4, S2: put the title of the show in quotes and capitalize every word in the title

P4, S3: put a comma after “days”

P4, S4: start the sentence with a transition word, like “Similarly, the U2 circle of friends...”

P4, S4: this is a rather long sentence, so consider breaking it into two after “pre-U2 years.” “I would imagine...”

P4, S5: put commas after “Peter’s,” and “then,”

P5, S1: say “same depth”; also, put a comma after “day”, and change “and that” to “which”

P5, S3: put a comma after “limited” and “available”

P5, S5: you refer to U2 as a plural throughout the piece, so change “its” to “their” for consistency

P5, S6: same thing, change “its” to “their”

P5, S7: same thing, change “its” to “their” and “its” to “they’ve”

P6, S1: say “has also”

P6, S2: italicize the title of the album, and put a comma after it

P7, S4: put the title of the radio show in quotes; additionally, you say “absolutely heartbroken” in the previous sentence, and then “absolutely beside myself” in this one. Remove “absolutely” from one of the phrases or pick a different word to avoid repetition.

P7, S5: you note that the show is “formerly weekly”—consider explaining why it is no longer weekly. Did it go off the air? Change to a daily or other format?

P7, S6: hyperlink “60 letters” to U2.com or to our WIR on the letters; put the title of the radio show in quotes; capitalize “The Edge,” and remove the comma after “Adam”

P7, S7: put a hyphen after “pre-“ and put a comma after “life”

P7, S8: put quotes around the radio show but keep the dash outside the quotes

P8, S1: put a comma after "offer"

P8, S3: put a comma after "channels"; change "its" to "their"; put a dash after "listen"
